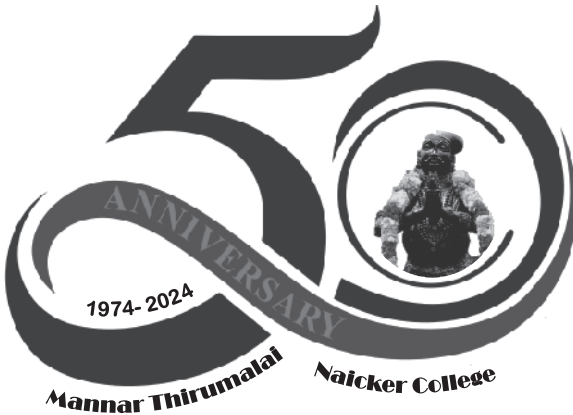

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SYMBOLIC CONSCIOUSNESS OF OUR EMBLEM

The emblem of the college was designed and painted by the founder Principal Dr. M.K. Sripathi Ph.D., D.Litt., of the college in the old premises of Rama Vilas Mandapam, Shenoy Nagar, Madurai in 1974 and stands the test of time.

Foremost to say, our emblem for the college is a testimony of 50 years of history and evolution of Mannar Thirumalai Naicker College, Madurai. It is symbolic of all the virtues embodied within a vertical oval shape that stands for a projected appealing positive message.

The college emblem holds the motto written in the state language Tamil which is an equivalent to the words of divine saint Thiruvalluvar, "Letters and Numbers are the two eyes of a man" which depict the vision of our college, to mould the learners into accomplished individuals through their learning at the college.

The oval logo holds a temple gopuram with a blossomed lotus on top and in the midst is the image of the king Mannar Thirumalai Naicker who shaped and enriched the city of Madurai during his rule in the 17th century.

The gopuram has an elevated entrance as a symbolic verdict of all goodness that enters into the campus to serve the world of youngsters who join the institution to learn and better their lives.

The temple gopuram as the strong focus of the emblem is an embodiment of strength and power that shapes the institution over long years of its establishment. The blossomed lotus on the top symbolizes wisdom and purity. It denotes enlightenment, self-regeneration and rebirth from ignorance to knowledge. Undoubtedly, this temple gopuram as a part of the college emblem reveals the sacredness of the place and also designates the college as a meeting place of the elite of a community to congregate and revitalize positivity of the place.

The most attractive feature of this emblem is the presence of mighty strong valiant Emperor Mannar Thirumalai Naicker who stands majestically in the middle of the temple gopuram denoting glory and potent which adds radiance to our college, all the years through and forever more in the realm of education. Most striking feature of the presence of a 'Mannar' in the emblem testifies the centre of administration, symbolic of the efficient running of the college.

Overall, Mannar Thirumalai Naicker College believes in imparting knowledge in lieu with the motto to make the world of the young encapsulated in wisdom in coherence to the mission of the college that aims at ethical, holistic and prudent livelihood.

The essence of our college emblem has elevated our endurance and potentiality to the prime of existence and has put the institution as a manifestation of excellence of students.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The renowned educational institution 'Mannar Thirumalai Naicker College', Madurai has created a niche on the educational map of South India. It is a unique alma mater and has shaped a galaxy of eminent men and women shining in various realms of life in India and abroad. This educational epitome was established by the untiring efforts of the philanthropic organization, 'Tamilnadu Naidu Mahajana Sangam', “under the patronage of like-minded patrons” in 1974 for the welfare, benefit and development of the educationally and economically backward Telugu speaking Naidu minority community.

The college has been christened with the name of 'Mannar Thirumalai Naicker', the most notable king of this region of the ancient past who has left a rich legacy and heritage to the city of Madurai, whose dictum was “To rule is to serve”. Undoubtedly, this dictum is carried forward by the college over the span of fifty years nurturing the young minds to educate and live strong in the macrocosm taking with them the efficacy of the college 'Mannar Thirumalai Naicker'.

The then Chief Minister of Tamilnadu, Dr. Kalaingar M. Karunanidhi inaugurated the college on 18th of August, 1974 and the foundation for the college building was laid by Cavalier Mr.G.K.Devarajulu Naidu. The College initially operated at 'Shri Rama Vilas Mandapam' in Shenoy Nagar, Madurai, with 153 students under an effective administration and was shifted to its own sprawling premises in Pasumalai on 4th of September 1979. It is befitting to bring to concern at this juncture that the Central Government allotted 24.52 acres of land adjoining National Highway for the expansion of this college. Fortunately, the State Government allotted 7.31 acres of land for the development of the college. However, the credit of initiating the allotment of land from the Central and State Governments goes to late Mr. K. Rajaram Naidu, the Former Minister and Speaker of the Assembly of Tamil Nadu.

With all the initiations it became a bountiful privilege that the college has been included in the list of colleges which have been affiliated permanently under section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956. Following the decorum, our college was upgraded to the status of imparting graduate programme to the students from the academic year 1979-80 and it became the pioneering institution to open the doors of higher education to women students in the city providing opportunities to pursue higher education along with their male counterparts in the early eighties. Foremost, our college has been rendering significant service to the society by fulfilling the

aspirations of thousands of first generation learners which made the institution witness an exponential growth in the last four decades.

Remarkably, the resolute efforts taken by the present management of our college, nearly 3,10,000 sq. feet of buildings were built in a very short span of time for the academic and administrative benefit of the officials and of the students. It is a significant milestone in the growth of our college. The members of the management along with the teaching and non-teaching staff are wholeheartedly committed to the task of making the institution, one of the most sought after colleges in the city of Madurai. Nevertheless, the perseverance of the management, the hard work of the members of the teaching staff and non-teaching staff with the cooperation of the students has paid rich dividends for a grand futurity and propensity.

At present, the college offers 7 Under Graduate programmes, 2 Post Graduate programmes and 5 Ph.D. programmes on varied disciplines of interest to the students. The college also offers 17 UG Programmes, 6 PG Programmes, 1 UG diploma and 1 PG diploma under Self Finance Stream. The college has five research departments which widen the research ambience of the scholars and the faculties of Commerce, English, Mathematics, Tamil and Physics. It is worthy to make a mark here that University Grants Commission has sanctioned 3 crores with the approval for the institution to launch 2 B.Voc and 6 Diploma programmes which are specifically offered within the campus by the Community College, a unit of social dimension of our college.

More so, the institution has built a good understanding with University Grants Commission, philanthropists from the community and the Members of Parliament and Legislative Assembly and benefits crores of funds to strengthen the infrastructure of the campus. The paramount structure is our library building that covers an area of 12,521 sq. feet, which houses the library in the ground floor with departments, classrooms and conference halls in the rest of the three floors. This huge palace like structure has been constructed owing to the sacrificial initiatives and commitment of the present management. Our library has a computerized central system with a barcoding facility which houses about 61,656 books, 71 Journals and 2 online Journals. The salient feature of our library is the vast reading hall which can accommodate about 120 students at a time. Interlocking concrete paver block are laid in the campus with rain water harvesting system. Picturesque stone benches have been erected under the cool and shadowy trees in front of the library building for the academic advantage of students. Arrangements have been made to provide safe drinking water with RO facility at vantage points of the campus. Lift & Ramp have been

provided by the Management for disabled students and staff members in the Library building.

Further, the administrative block houses a magnificent office of the Controller of Examinations, Dean's office, Valuation Halls in the ground floor along with class rooms in the first, second and third floors in an expanse of 57,232 sq. feet. This block is the crowning glory of the institution and stands as an eloquent testimony to the devotion of the management. There are 100 well-furnished and ICT enabled class rooms with very good ventilation and a huge auditorium equipped with spectacular seating arrangements to accommodate more than 2000 delegates ingrained with efficient lighting system and acoustics. The institution boasts of a playground encompassing a sprawling area of 7.48 acres, having the facilities of 400 mts. standard track, multipurpose cricket ground, cricket nets, football field, kabaddi, kho-kho, volley ball and badminton courts.

No institution can be holistic without an eatery, a place where students gather to freshen and satiate their appetite. It is for this reason two hygienic canteens are functioning within the campus providing nutritive food at nominal charges to the happiness of the students of the college. Being in the digital world, it is noteworthy to bring into focus the presence of well-structured modern conference halls, smart classrooms, digital language lab, fitness centre, health centre, net café in the campus provisioning comfort zone of academic performances for students. Apart from all the modernization, the campus has well-built structured buildings with modern amenities to house women's hostel, a student amenity centre along with exclusive office rooms for Controller of Examinations, Deans of Arts, Science, Research, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) along with 6 Computer labs holding 534 systems with 100 mbps of Wi-Fi and LAN-lines. The infrastructure facilities make our institution a 'state of art' of the region.

As like any other colleges of the area, our college owns a bus to help the rural students of the adjacent areas of the college. Besides, transport facility has been arranged exclusively for women students and TNSTC plies a few buses for them from the campus to key destinations.

The 'Ipso Facto' of the college is that on a gaining tempo in the years of its growth, it was reaccredited and was bestowed with the most coveted 'A' Grade by NAAC in cycle 2 in 2018. In fact, University Grants Commission granted Autonomy status and it was renewed in 2022 which paves way for having not only the academic freedom but also the flexibility in functioning at all levels. At present, 2,374 students are pursuing higher education and they are being served by 126 Teaching staff and 26 Administrative staff and they are working with commitment and devotion to scale the institution on a par excellence with the best institutions of the state.

College Management Higher Education Scholarship

The institution provides scholarship under the scheme College Management Higher Education Scholarship from 2015-2016. The scholarship was initiated and executed to meet the tuition fee of parentless students, single parented students and students who excel in sports. Fee concession, free accommodation in hostel, free breakfast and milk for girl students are given under this scheme. Students must seek the support of the college office for any further details.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. No student can abstain himself / herself from college without getting prior permission from the HOD.
2. If a student abstains himself/herself from college due to unavoidable circumstances, the application for leave must be submitted on his / her returning to the college.
3. If the attendance of any student falls below the stipulated number of days, he/she will not be allowed to take their Summative Examinations

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

1. An academic year is divided into two Semesters. Odd semester commences from June and ends in October and even semester commences from December and ends in April.
2. The eligibility for undergraduate programme is a pass in +2 or any other equivalent degree as recognized by Madurai Kamaraj University.
3. At the time of admission the candidates should submit original Transfer Certificate issued by the Head of the previous educational institution.
4. Candidate securing admission through any malpractice is subject to termination.
5. Candidate will be permitted inside the classroom only after the payment of all the fee for the semester. At any instance the special fee paid will not be refunded.
6. The roll numbers of the students who fail to pay the fee within the stipulated time will be removed. However, the candidate can be readmitted at the discretion of the Principal, provided he / she pays the readmission fee and the penalty.

RULES, CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

1. Every student should come with a proper haircut and wear clean, neat and formal dress, fitted to our culture and tradition. Casual wears such as T-shirts, shorts and jeans must be avoided.
2. During class hours a student cannot go out of the class without the permission of the teacher concerned. The use of cell phones is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Students who violate this rule will have to face disciplinary action.
3. The college expects students of both sex to foster a healthy and decent relationship both on campus and off campus. The very spirit of co-education lies in facilitating such a relationship. Any behaviour contrary to this spirit is deemed unlawful and punishable.
4. During leisure hours, students are advised to use the library, and internet browsing centre.
5. During leisure hours, women students should go to the waiting hall or library. They should not stay in the classrooms.
6. When a teacher enters the classroom, the students should raise and keep standing until they are asked to sit.
7. Late comers are not allowed to enter the classrooms.
8. Students shall move from one classroom to another or get out of the classroom in an orderly manner, without making any noise.
9. Students should bring prescribed textbooks to the classes every day. If failed they will be sent out of the classroom.
10. Defacing the blackboards or walls will be severely dealt with.
11. Students should handle the furniture and other properties with care. Damaging the furniture will lead to penalty or suspension from college.
12. **Students should wear their identity cards inside the campus.**
13. They should stay away from any anti social activities.
14. Without the permission of the Principal, students are not permitted to circulate any printed materials or pamphlets.
15. Ragging in any form is a serious offence and banned by the State Government and it will be dealt seriously.
16. Damage fee will be collected for any damage caused by the students knowingly or unknowingly.
17. Visitors are not allowed to meet the students in the classrooms.
18. Students should take care of their belongings. The institution will not be responsible for any loss.

It is well equipped with a range of facilities including smart class room, audio-visual room, Netcafe and talking book Library for visually challenged, stack room, reading hall, own book reading hall, reprography section. The alumni, faculty members and philanthropists come forward to donate thousands of books to enhance the Library throughout the year.

The College Library remains closed on all Sundays and Public Holidays.

Rules and Regulations

- A separate library bar code will be given to each student.
- Entry is permitted only with a proper ID Card
- Strict Silence should be maintained in the Library.
- Usage of Mobile Phones inside the Library is prohibited.
- Any sorts of writing or marking in the library book is strictly prohibited
- Students or staff members who decide to leave the college must return the Library books before getting relieved.

- Issue and return of books has been computerized.
- Own book reading hall can be utilized by the students as well as staff members.

Services

Membership is open to all the Staff and Students of the college

- Members are requested not to bring their belongings inside the Library (except own book reading hall)
- Maximum number of books that can be borrowed from the Library.
UG Students – 2; PG Students – 3
- The transaction (borrowing and returning books) must be carried out only by concerned student member
- Members must ensure that they have received a book in good condition during the time of borrowing.
- Renewal of books is permitted for one time on condition that the student should bring the borrowed book at the time of renewal.
- Members are advised to return/ renew the books on or before the due date.
- A fine of Rs. 0.50 ps. is charged for each day a book is overdue.
- Students shall replace the book or pay thrice the cost of the book in case they lose it. If one book from a collection of books is lost or damaged, the student has to replace the entire collection.

SILENT TOKEN SYSTEM

Silent Token System is a generous initiative commenced by the college to issue free lunch to over 175 students everyday. Students who travel from distant places and belong to families with economic disadvantages get benefited by the practice. They can collect their tokens in person and later avail their lunch. The management along with both teaching and non-teaching staff, students and alumni come together to donate the fund needed for the packed lunches.

The college canteen's staff ensure in delivering quality food and satisfy the requirements of the students.

LABORATORIES

1. Strict silence and discipline must be maintained in the laboratories.
2. Students should handle the apparatus and other equipments in the laboratories with care.
3. Breaking or causing damage to the apparatus and equipments will be seriously viewed, and appropriate damage fee will be collected.
4. Students should maintain the laboratories clean and neat.

EXAMINATION PROCEDURES

The college follows semester pattern. The assessment of the students has two components.

- i) Continuous Internal Assessment (tests, assignments, seminars) will be conducted in every semester for 25% of marks.
- ii) End Semester summative examinations will be held in November and April for the odd and even Semesters respectively for 75% of marks. End Semester Examinations are conducted in Three modes – Written / OMR / Computer Based Examinations.

Outgoing students who have arrears in all the Semester Examinations can appear for the same during June supplementary examinations.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL

The hostel has 53 Well-furnished rooms and it can accommodate around 200 students. It is highly secured with 24/7 professional security and CCTV cameras to ensure the safety of the students. Hostel has a spacious Dining hall with Kitchen, Visitor's room, Netcafe, Creche, Women's recreation centre, Yoga hall, Reading hall, Meeting hall, Sports facilities and an open and closed Auditorium.

Rules and Regulations

- Even during emergency situations, students should send messages to their parents only with the permission of warden.

PLACEMENT CELL

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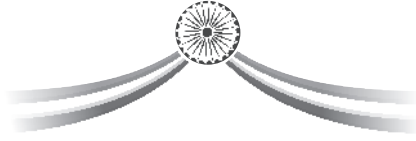

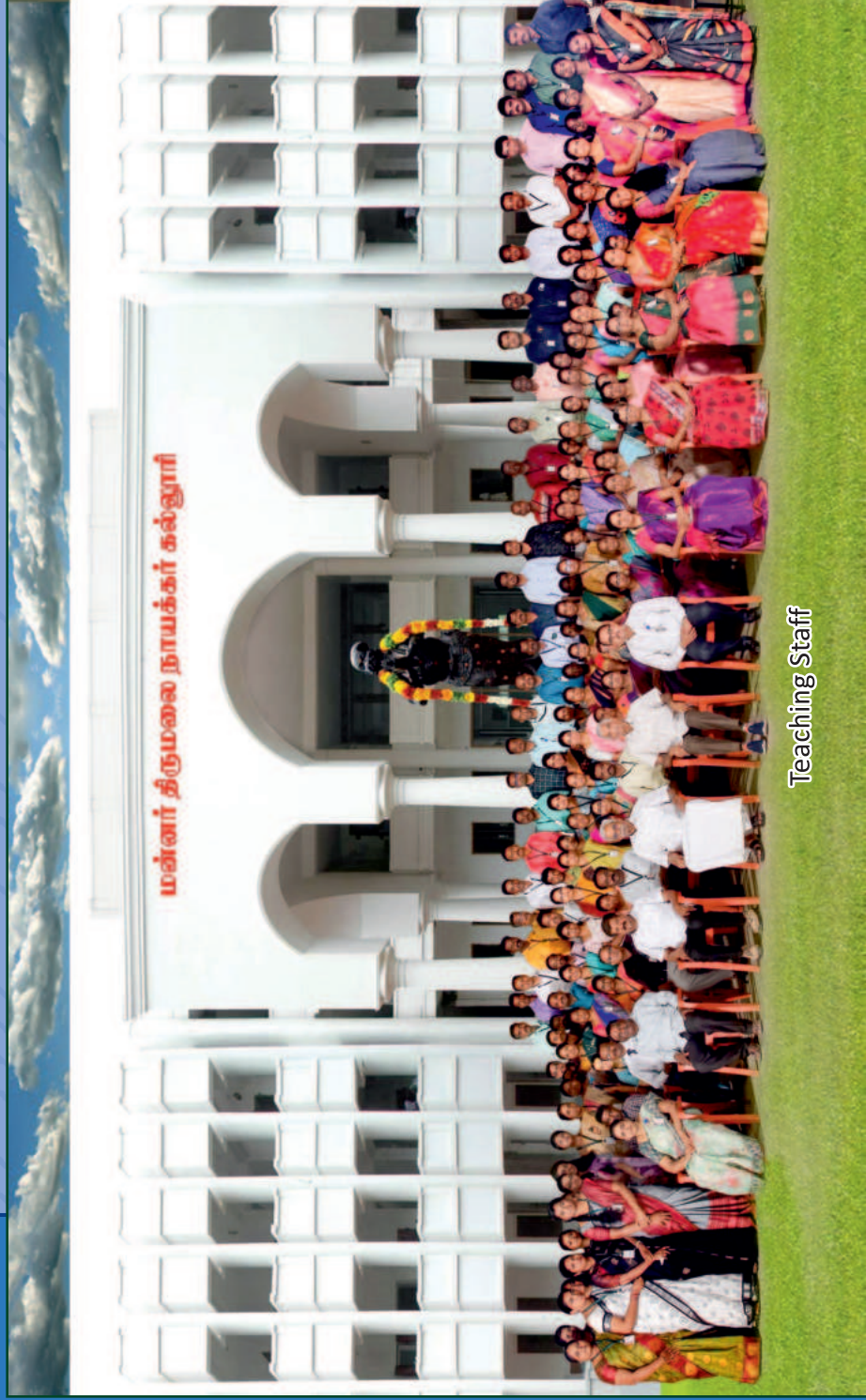
